## WEST JEFFERSON MEDICAL CENTER NATIONALLY RECOGNIZED WITH AN 'A' FOR THE FALL 2019 LEAPFROG HOSPITAL SAFETY GRADE

(Marrero, La.) November 7, 2019 – West Jefferson Medical Center (West Jefferson) was awarded an 'A' in <u>fall 2019 Leapfrog Hospital Safety Grade</u>, <u>a national distinction</u> recognizing West Jefferson's achievements protecting patients from harm and providing safer health care. The Leapfrog Group is an independent national watchdog organization driven by employers and other purchasers of health care committed to improving health care quality and safety for consumers and purchasers. The Safety Grade assigns an 'A', 'B', 'C', 'D' or 'F' grade to all general hospitals across the country based on their performance in preventing medical errors, injuries, accidents, infections and other harms to patients in their care.

"We are extremely proud of this distinction as it is a reflection of our unwavering dedication to our patients," said Darlene Gondrella, Vice President of Quality at West Jefferson Medical Center. "It highlights our extraordinary physicians and staff who work continuously to improve the safety of the care we deliver to every patient who walks through our doors."

"'A' hospitals show us their leadership is protecting patients from preventable medical harm and error," said Leah Binder, president and CEO of The Leapfrog Group. "It takes genuine commitment at every level – from clinicians to administrators to the board of directors – and we congratulate the teams who have worked so hard to earn this A."

Developed under the guidance of a <u>national Expert Panel</u>, the Leapfrog Hospital Safety Grade uses 28 measures of publicly available hospital safety data to assign grades to more than 2,600 U.S. acute-care hospitals twice per year. The Hospital Safety Grade's methodology is peer-reviewed and fully transparent, and the results are free to the public.

West Jefferson was awarded an 'A' grade today, when Leapfrog announced grades for the fall 2019 update.
